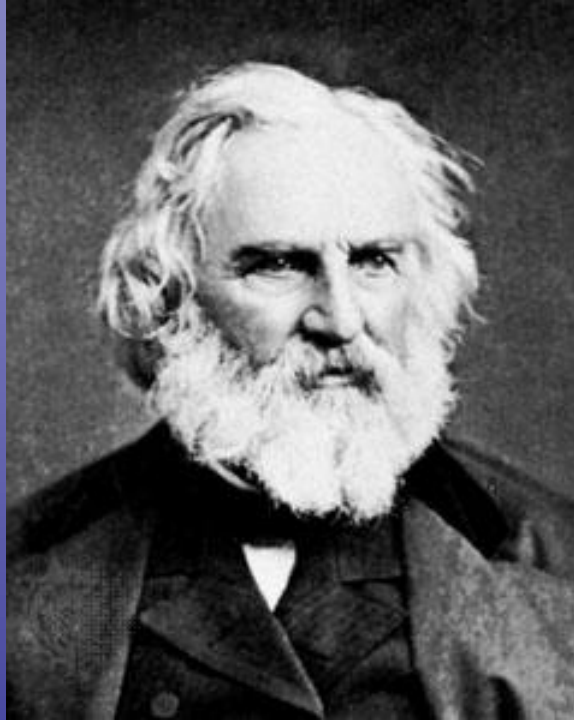

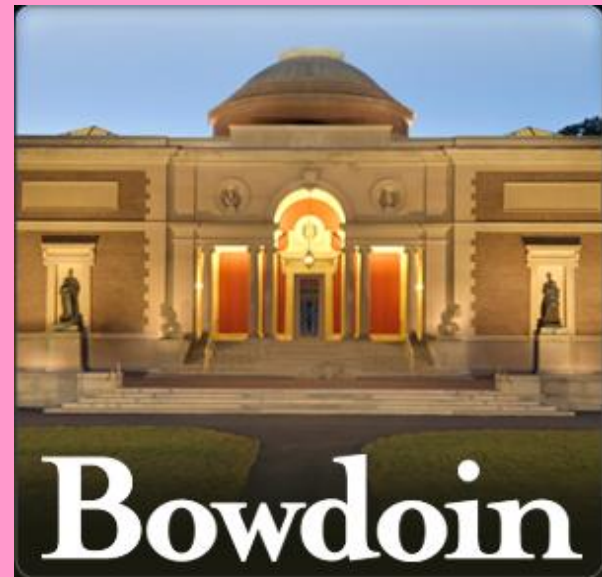
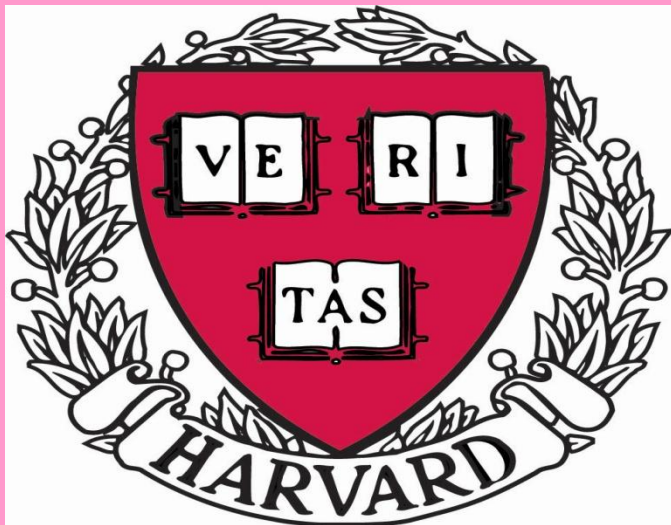

Early Life

- Portland, Maine
- Feb. 27, 1807
- Lived in Europe for three years, and found his love for Old World civilization.
- 1831: Married Mary Storer Potter
- Toured European and Scandinavian countries for 4 years
- During his tour his wife died

Schooling

- Attended Portland Academy and then Bowdoin College
- Major: Professorship of Modern Languages
- Was offered a job at Harvard in 1894, did not teach until 1897.
- Resigned from his job in 1851 and dedicated his life to writing



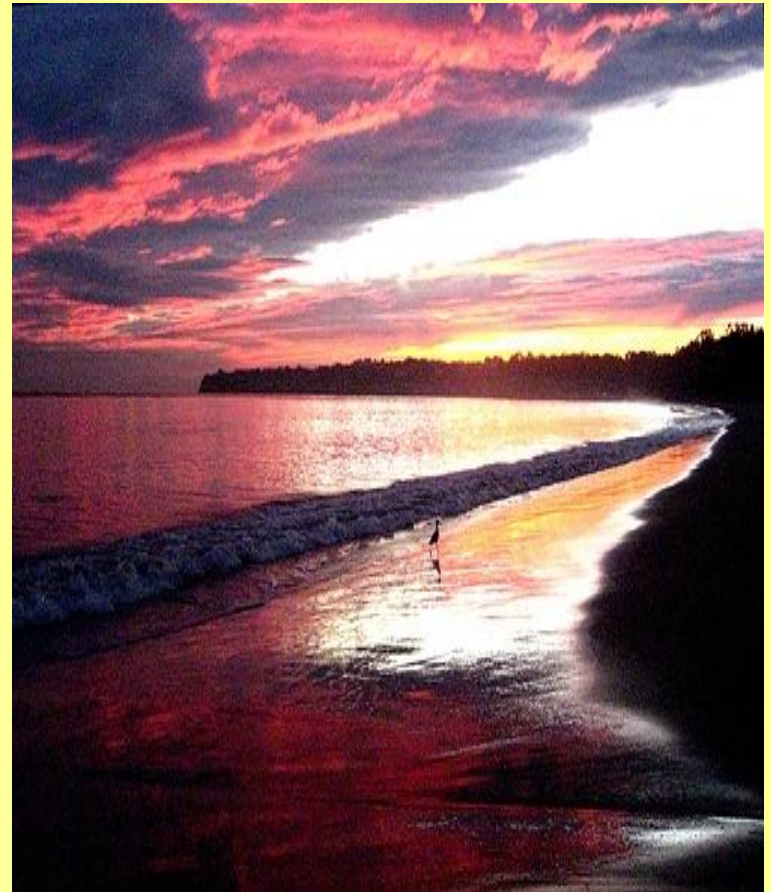

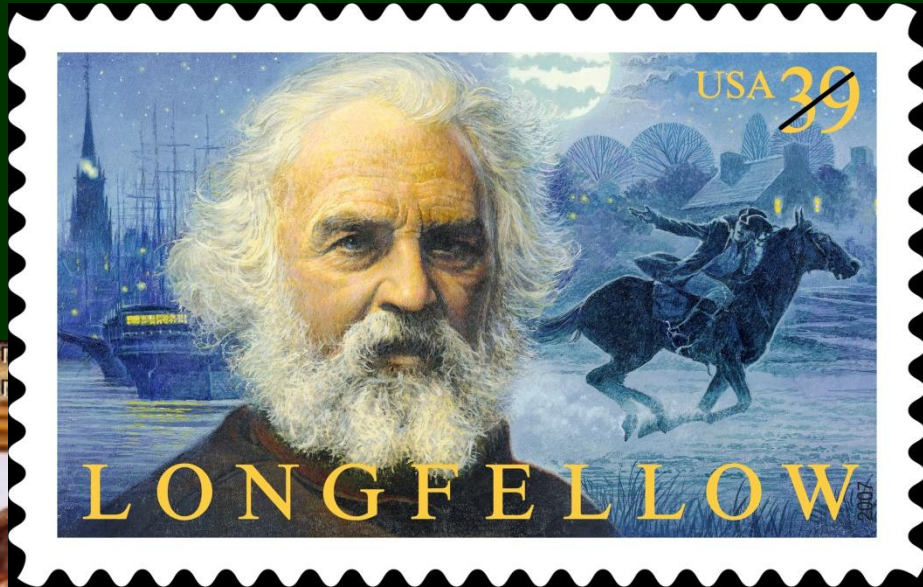
