Principal's Message

Our students in grades 2-5 will be participating in the TCAP achievement tests this Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday (April 15-18), and next Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday (April 20-22). Our teachers and students have worked hard this year and now it is time for the students to show all that they have learned. Tusculum View traditionally has done well on these tests and we expect this year for our students to do equally as well. There are several things that parents can do to help with this process these coming weeks:

- Make sure your child has an appropriate bedtime and is getting plenty of rest.
- Provide a good, nutritious breakfast at home, or allow your child to eat breakfast at school.
 We begin serving breakfast at 7:30 each morning.
- If you normally transport your child to school, please have them here on time (by 8:05) so that they

can be settled, organized, and ready to test. We will dismiss from the cafeteria at 8:05 a.m. and our testing schedule begins promptly at 8:30.

• Encourage your child to work hard, and give his best effort on each section of the test.

Kindergarten Registration

The Greeneville City School System will hold kindergarten registration during the week of April 27 – May 1 Hours of registration will be from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Parents of kindergarten children residing inside the city limits must register their children at the school in their zone. Parents of kindergarten children residing outside the city limits who will be making application as tuition students must register their children at Hal Henard Elementary School. Tuition applicants for kindergarten will be on a first-come basis. Registration for kindergarten tuition students will be on Thursday, April 30 and Friday, May 1 from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. All tuition kindergarten students will be registered for the Greeneville City School System's kindergarten program generally rather than for a specific school. Parents will be able to request the school of their choice. Placements will be confirmed later.

Tuition applicants for grades 1 through 12 will be handled at the school being requested. Applications for these grades also should be filed on Thursday, April 30 and Friday, May 1 from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Tuition and out-of-zone students currently enrolled in the Greeneville City School System will be supplied the

appropriate forms for registration before the end of the school year.

At the time of registration, parents should present the following items for their child: certified birth certificate (kindergarten students must be 5 years old on or before September 30, 2009); physical examination report; required immunizations; and Social Security card.

It is important that all children entering the Greeneville City School System for the first time be registered so that personnel and materials will be available at the beginning of the school year. Also, it is a state law that children must successfully complete a state-approved kindergarten program before they be allowed to enter first grade.

Lunch Charges

The cafeteria is trying to clear up all lunch charges. If you have received a call or letter regarding charges to your child's account you are requested to send money to clear your child's account. All charges must be paid in full by the end of April and no charges will be allowed in the month of May.

Global Art Connections

Students in our Tusculum View art classes have been studying about the country of Belize. We started in February learning about the country through discussions, Internet research and Google Earth. They learned about the flag, people, terrain, climate, art, schools and much more.

Ms. Fine tied into her art curriculum projects that the 2-5th grade students did that were ultimately (at the end of March) sent to schools in Belize. The 2nd and 3rd graders learned about the differences between Belize and Tennessee. They did a drawing about things unique to Tennessee which included a TN map, state flag and their picture. The 4th and 5th grade students focused on large Alphabet Books of things "American/Tennessee" which could be also put on a wall in a classroom.

Once these artworks were done, students from Tusculum College came to talk about Belize. Approximately ten students from

Tusculum College go to Belize each year to do projects connected to their Service Learning Class which is taught by Mrs. Robin Fife. Our 5th graders met with the college students at the end of March. There was a lot of sharing, questions, and at the end we gave them our artwork to take to Belize.

Once the college students returned we asked them back to our school to find out about their trip and what happened to our artwork. At the beginning of April they came and all of our students enjoyed a Powerpoint presentation, question and answer session and real artifacts discussion. They even gave us artwork that the Belize children did in return after receiving the artwork that we made. We have that artwork on display across from the artroom.

This was a wonderful experience for Tusculum View to "Go Global" and learn more about a country that many of us did not know anything about. We all look forward to more projects in the next school year that we will share with our "school friends in Belize".
